Is this course for you?

This course is for language teachers, who wish to incorporate story, video and image in their teaching. The course addresses how video can engage language learners' needs for narrative. Participants should have a minimum English language level corresponding to B1 on the CFR.

Course Overview and Outcomes

What is it about video? Why do we feel the need to turn to sites like YouTube as a source of material and inspiration? The answer is simple. Like all human beings, language learners need narrative. As teachers, we intuitively know this. And video provides us with a constant stream of visual stories to engage them.

This course will show you how to use video narratives to engage students and get them listening, thinking, speaking, collaborating, problem solving and more. By participating in the course, you will learn fundamental principles and tech-

- Making the most of video in and out of your classroom – including online contexts
- Exploring how to engage students and get them listening, thinking, speaking, reading, writing, problem solving and much more
- Improving classroom storytelling skills and helping students do the same
- Task-setting in which students make use of video cameras in and out of the classroom
- Making the most of video cameras in the teacher's hands
- Building a bank of original Lesson Stream lesson plans

Specific course content comes from feedback you and other participants give us through pre-course questionnaires, identifying your needs and priorities. We build time into the course for reflection, to consider how to adapt the content to your own professional context.

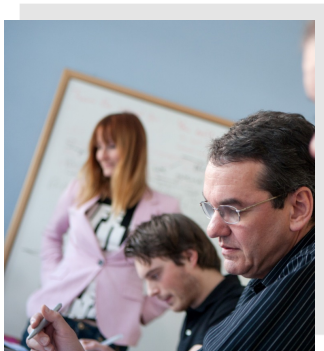


Teaching approaches
