Target Audience

This course is for teachers who do apply or are about to apply CLIL in their teaching. Participants should have a minimum English language level corresponding to B1 on the CFR.

Course Overview and Outcomes

This course will help you to identify and understand the characteristics of a CLIL-based approach. As part of the course you will learn how to develop your students' knowledge of a curriculum subject as well as their language skills and proficiency. The course is highly practical, using current CLIL theory to illustrate lesson design, and effective classroom practice. As a participant on the course you will have the opportunity to share your own experiences and concerns, with a view to developing and improving your own practice and implementing change within your own particular educational contexts.

Content:

Content and Language Integrated Learning includes content drawn from some or all of the following areas:

- Personal language awareness and the language of the CLIL classroom;
- Identifying the key parameters of the CLIL approach
- Identifying key subject discourse and content-specific vocabulary
- Exploring materials and methods appropriate to CLIL
- Creating a language-rich classroom environment
- Sharing and analysing resources for CLIL content areas
- Analysing the content-language relationship
- Guiding input and supporting output in CLIL classes
- Micro-teaching and small project-based presentations

Specific course content comes from feedback you and other participants give us through pre-course questionnaires, identifying your needs and priorities. We build time into the course for reflection, to consider how to adapt the content to your own professional context, and practice with the tools and platforms explored.

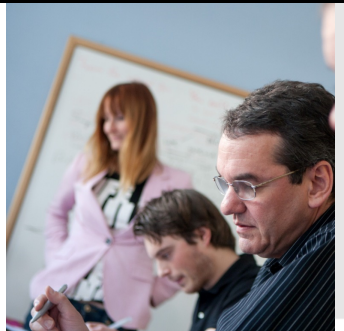
